Notice concerning Payment of Dividends from Surplus Earnings

At the Board of Directors meeting held on May 19th, 2017, Brother Industries, Ltd. (The "Company") resolved to pay dividends from surplus earnings to the shareholders registered as of March 31st, 2017 as follows

2. Reasons for paying dividends from surplus earnings

Brother Industries, Ltd. sets a basic policy of consolidated dividend payout ratio to about 30% and according to its financial results, taking into consideration maintaining adequate levels of internal reserves for investment for further growth and cash flow.

Under this policy stated above, the Company increased the year-end dividend per share for the fiscal year that ended in March 31st, 2017 by 6 yen to 24 yen per share from its original forecast. As a result of this increase, the annual dividend for this fiscal year will become 42 yen per share with the 18 yen dividend for the end of the second quarter, which had already been paid.
